Traditional Indian Clothes

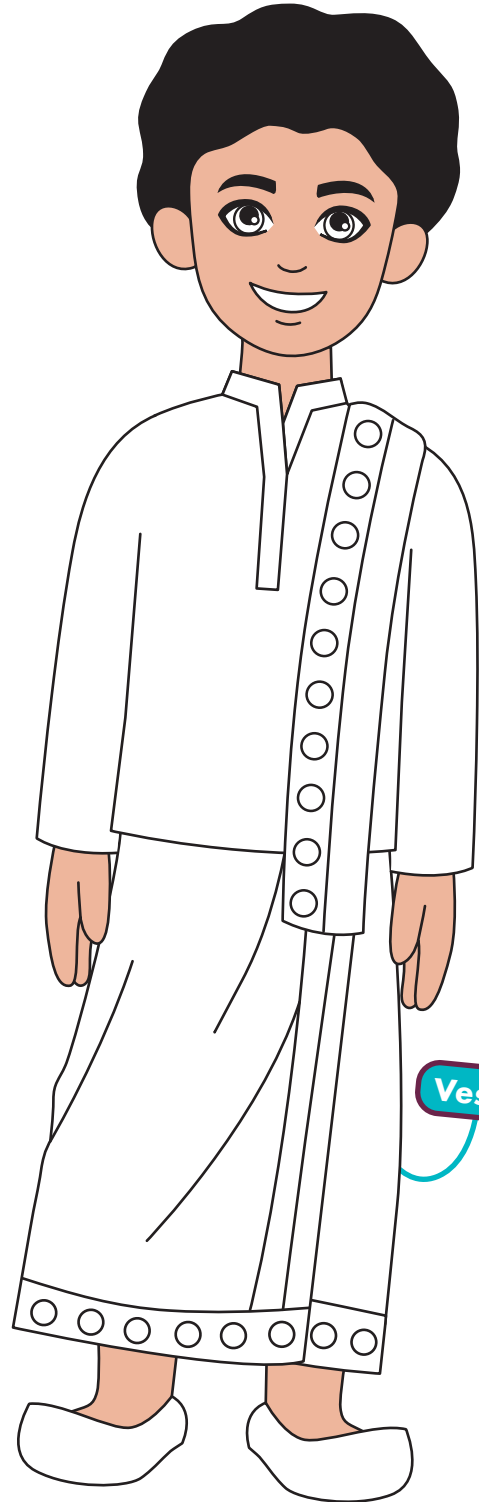
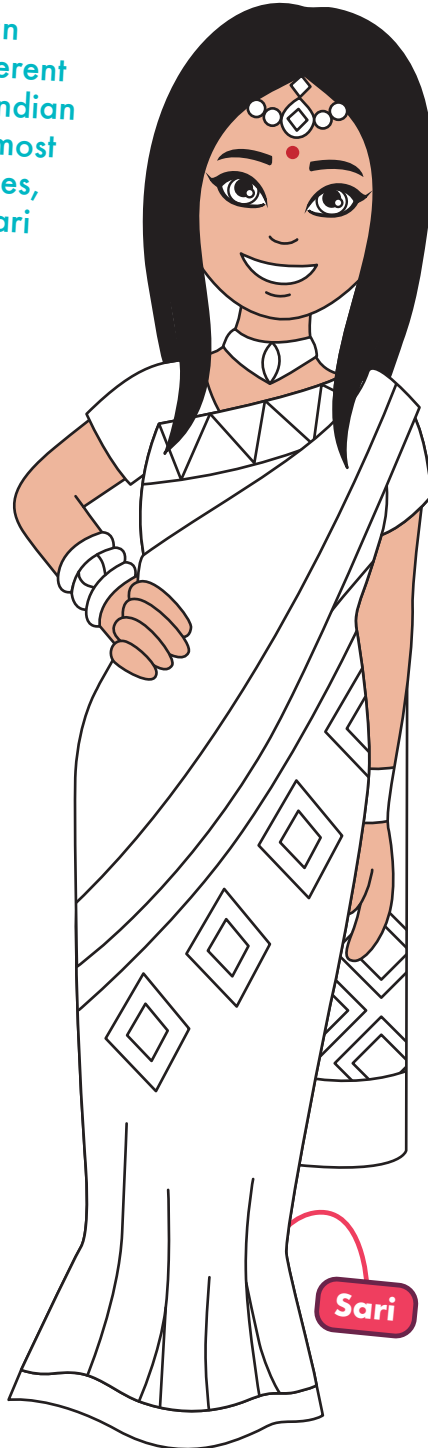


Traditional Indian clothes look different among various Indian communities. In most Indian communities, women wear a sari and men wear a dhoti or veshti.

A sari is a long length of rectangular cloth that is elaborately draped around the body. Saris are commonly made in cotton or silk and come in many different colours and patterns.

A vesti, also called dhoti, is a long white cloth wrapped around the waist and knotted either in the front or back.



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
