


What is Deepavali?

Salt Dough Lamp.



05 Materials



Salt Dough

- I cup plain flour*
- ½ cup table salt
- ½ cup water
- Measuring cup
- Medium mixing bowl
- Whisk or spoon
- Parchment paper/silicone baking mat
- Baking tray

*Note: Do not use self-rising flour — it will cause the oil lamp to bubble or rise while baking.





Decorations

- Acrylic or nontoxic paint
- Paintbrushes
- Water
- Bowl or cup for water
- Plate or palette
- Cloth rag or paper towels
- Tea light or flameless candle

Optional Decorations

- Glue
- Glitter
- Sequins




06 Instructions






Gather your materials in one place.




In a mixing bowl, stir flour and salt together.



Slowly add water while stirring flour and salt mixture until it is fully combined and smooth.




Remove the dough from the mixing bowl and knead it for 5 minutes.



Let the dough rest for 15 minutes.


Tip: Add a little flour if the dough is too sticky or a few drops of water if it is too dry.




Preheat oven to 93 degree Celsius. Split your dough into 3-4 sections.






Shape the dough into oil lamps. Leave a space for your candles.




Place on parchment paper or silicone baking mat on a baking sheet.




Bake in the preheated* oven for 2 hours, until dry and hard. Allow to cool completely.


*Adult supervison needed.



You can let your oil lamps air dry for a couple of days instead of baking them in an oven.




Paint your oil lamps. Let them completely dry.



Try painting designs onto your oil lamps using a fine detail paintbrush.

You can also glue glitter and sequins to your oil lamps for additional sparkle.



Light your oil lamps and place around your home for Deepavali!

Make your own little bag to bring along for your festive visiting!


Materials

- 2. Cut out according to the lines carefully.
- 3. Glue the edges accordingly.
- 4. Punch holes on marked areas.
- 5. Tie string or ribbon through holes.
- 6. Bring your bag out for visiting!
