

# What is Deepavali?








### 03 What is Deepavali?



Deepavali falls on the new moon day in the solar month known as Aippassi or Ashvin in the Hindu calendar. This is typically between 15 October to 15 November in the Gregorian calendar.

### The Defeat of Narakasura

Deepavali commemorates the day Lord Krishna slayed the tyrannical demon, Narakasura.

The people welcomed the victorious Lord Krishna with lighted lamps illuminating the entire city.

Since then, Deepavali has been celebrated with lights and oil lamps.

### The Defeat of Ravana

According to the Ramayana epic,
Deepavali also marks the return of
Lord Rama, Sita and Lakshmana after
their 14-year exile and their defeat of
the demon king, Ravana.

People celebrated this occasion by lighting up oil lamps to illuminate the way and welcome their king, hence inspiring the tradition of lighting lamps on Deepavali.

Deepavali is known as the Festival of Lights. Light up your homes with your very own Salt Dough Lamp.



### 09 Materials



#### Salt Dough

- I cup plain flour\*
- ½ cup table salt
- ½ cup water
- Measuring cup
- Medium mixing bowl
- Whisk or spoon
- Parchment paper/silicone baking mat
- Baking tray

\*Note: Do not use self-rising flour — it will cause the oil lamp to bubble or rise while baking.





#### **Decorations**

- Acrylic or nontoxic paint
- Paintbrushes
- Water
- Bowl or cup for water
- Plate or palette
- Cloth rag or paper towels
- Tea light or flameless candle

### Optional Decorations

- Glue
- Glitter
- Sequins




### 10 Instructions





Gather your materials in one place.



In a mixing bowl, stir flour and salt together.



Slowly add water while stirring flour and salt mixture until it is fully combined and smooth.




Remove the dough from the mixing bowl and knead it for 5 minutes.



Let the dough rest for 15 minutes.

Tip: Add a little flour if the dough is too sticky or a few drops of water if it is too dry.




Preheat oven to 93 degree Celsius. Split your dough into 3-4 sections.

### 11 Instructions






Shape the dough into oil lamps. Leave a space for your candles.




Place on parchment paper or silicone baking mat on a baking sheet.



Bake in the preheated\* oven for 2 hours, until dry and hard. Allow to cool completely.

\*Adult supervison needed.



You can let your oil lamps air dry for a couple of days instead of baking them in an oven.



Paint your oil lamps. Let them completely dry.



Try painting designs onto your oil lamps using a fine detail paintbrush.

### 12 Instructions





You can also glue glitter and sequins to your oil lamps for additional sparkle.



Light your oil lamps and place around your home for Deepavali!



#### **Materials**


- Colouring Materials

- 5. Tie string or ribbon through holes.
- 6. Bring your bag out for visiting!



### 25 How do you prepare for Deepavali?





Preparations for Deepavali begin about a month before the actual day.

The home is cleaned, new clothes are purchased and festive sweets and savoury snacks are prepared.

The entrances of homes are decorated with *kolam/rangoli* which are multi-coloured floor decorations made from coloured rice powder and/or rice grains.
